



WALES TOUR TERMS & CONDITIONS

BOOKINGS AND PAYMENT

All bookings are made by phoning 087 2988499 and are on a first come first served basis.

Prices are correct at time of printing, however circumstances beyond our control, eg; government taxes, currency fluctuations and ferry/hotel rates may cause slight increases.

A deposit of €100 per person is required to book a place and can be paid by credit card, debit cards, cheques or cash. Balance payments are to be made 8 weeks prior to departure.

You will receive a booking confirmation, terms and conditions, the payment schedule for the tour and an invoice. Failure to send balance payment may result in cancellation of your booking. Bookings made within four weeks of the departure date will only be accepted with full payment. Failure to meet this requirement may result in non-acceptance of your booking.

LICENCE AND INSURANCE

All participants must bring their full 'A' category motorcycle licence which must be in date. In the event of being stopped by the U.K. customs or police your licence will be your form of identity. Provisional licence holders are not allowed to ride in Great Britain and are therefore not allowed on this tour.

Insurance certificates must also be brought with you, please note that anyone who has AON or AXA insurance must notify their insurer when they are travelling to the U.K. at least a fortnight prior to departure this will be your responsibility.

BREAKDOWN RECOVERY

Emergency, accident and breakdown recovery is not provided on this tour.

All participants with Carole Nash insurance cover will have breakdown recovery in the U.K. The A.A. and R.A.C provide breakdown recovery however existing members of such organisations must check that their breakdown policy covers the U.K.

Temporary 5 day U.K. breakdown recovery can be obtained through the A.A. for €59 for motorcycles up to 8 years old and can be arranged by calling 01-617 9988. Although it is not compulsory it is advisory that you have proper cover in the eventuality of a breakdown or emergency.

CANCELLATION OF BOOKINGS

The organisers reserve the right to cancel a tour if there are less than five persons booked. In such cases an applicant will be offered an alternative date or a refund of all monies paid. Notification will be given at least one week prior to departure.

TRANSFER OF BOOKING

If a person, for any reason, is unable to travel he/she may transfer the booking to a third party. In such cases at least two weeks notice should be given and the changes will be subject to an administration fee of €40.

CANCELLATION CHARGES

If an applicant cancels a tour the following charges will be levied:

- eight weeks prior to departure the amount of the deposit
- four to eight weeks—50 per cent of total tour cost
- less than four weeks—100 per cent of total tour cost

ALCOHOL

If any rider appears to be over the legal limit on the morning of departure or the morning in Wales then that person will not be allowed to ride with the group or participate in the tour. The safety of the group and the individual is foremost.

DEPARTURE

All tours start from the Shell garage next to the Point Depot on the East Wall Road, Dublin 1. The meeting time is 6 a.m. All bikes must leave this garage with a full tank of petrol as all fuel stops in Wales are pre-determined. Your licence will be checked before departure. If you are not at this meeting point on time the group will leave without you.

DELAYS

The organisers cannot be held responsible for unforeseen delays to a journey or ferry crossing (to or from the U.K.). In the event of a delay participants will be responsible for providing their own meals, travel and accommodation.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY

Participants are required to ensure that their motorcycles are in a good road legal condition and have valid insurance and road tax.

Participants are responsible for their own motorcycle, its use and conformity to U.K. laws and regulations. They are also responsible for any pillion passenger being carried.

An accident that occurs to a rider or pillion passenger, will never be the organisers responsibility.

Should a motorcycle suffer a mechanical failure, or accidental damage, it is the responsibility of the owner.

If for any reason a participant decides to leave the tour during its duration he or she will not be recompensed.

FORCE MAJEURE

Means unusual and unforeseeable circumstances beyond normal control, the consequences of which could not have been avoided even if all due care had been exercised. Such circumstances or events include (but are not limited to) industrial dispute, unavoidable technical problems with ferry services, natural disasters and adverse weather conditions. In the event of any of the above refunds or compensation payments cannot be made.

DISCLAIMER

Please note prices are subject to 2005 ferry rates and timetables, final accommodation choice and tariffs. Any changes to the prices will be notified at the time of booking. All tours will take place providing at least five bikes have been confirmed.
